### **Course Description:**

During the first year of the program, students will develop and enhance their communication skills through the study of themes in Spanish and Hispanic cultures. Students acquire additional vocabulary and language structures so that they can orally communicate and participate in classroom activities. Emphasis is placed on oral communication as well as reading, writing, and listening. Students will be using Spanish to communicate and actively participate in the class. The curriculum is aligned to the New Jersey Learning Standards as well as the American Council of Teaching Foreign Languages (ACTFL) a national organization.

### **Course Competencies/ Learning Objectives**

Students who successfully complete Spanish 1 CP will be competent in the following areas:

- Students will be able to:
  - communicate using memorized words and phrases to talk about familiar topics related to school, home, and the community.
  - communicate using words, lists, and simple sentences to ask and answer questions, to handle simple transactions related to everyday life.
  - apply their learned knowledge of the target language in the areas of reading, writing, speaking and listening

  - any other type of assessment used to capture evidence of learning at the culmination of a unit of study.
- Examples of Minor Assessments include items that are formative in nature, such as:
  - quizzes,
  - reading comprehension checks,
  - response journals,
  - exit tickets,
  - in class worksheets
  - any other type of assessment that is diagnostic in nature and used to guide instruction and provide ongoing feedback to students.
- Note: grades for individual assignments are entered into Genesis for the marking period in which the assignment is collected, and not a subsequent marking period.

- Extra Credit will only be available for assignments that have been approved ahead of time by the teacher and department supervisor.
- In this course, it is expected that students will submit only their best work, and teachers reserve the right not to accept work that is substantially below what a student is capable of producing.
