

## **FAQ: Monday, April 1, 2019**

Q: What is the additional cost because of new bus routes?

A: At this time we have not received the transportation study back. Once we do it will be discussed in the transportation sub committee and minutes reported out.

Q: Who is leading these committees and how frequently will these committee meetings be held in the month of April?

A: Committees will be led by members of the administrative team. Since the reconfiguration timeline was slowed down, people that were selected for the subcommittees can expect to hear back next week for a first meeting to take place the end of April/first week of May. After that the committees will meet monthly and report out at the BOE meetings.

Q: Would the committees all meet on the same day/time of the week?

A: No. The first meeting will be scheduled. After that, meetings dates and times will be decided before the committee adjourns for that session.

Q: Will the sixth graders still be eligible for advanced Math, thereby making them eligible for pre-algebra in 7th grade? Pre-algebra is needed in order to take the Mates entrance exam, and be accepted into the school.

A: Yes. We were not looking to change the advanced academic tracks/offersings.

Q: Will there be a before and after care at each school?

A: That is the hope. We will know more in the coming weeks once we have a chance to sit down with Right At School.

Q: Who is going to answer my questions? You conveniently leave out the costs to the taxpayers regarding this plan. Who is responsible for reading the questions and answering them?

A: Dr. Latwis and the administrative team are responding to the questions. This proposal and model is actually very fiscally responsible as it balances sections in one building for the whole district versus balancing by building which leads to more classes needed. The only cost would be related to transportation which we do not have the review yet. See above.
